#### TBDBITL Alumni Club, Inc. Board of Governors May 11, 2020

**Call to Order:** A regular meeting of the Board of Governors, TBDBITL Alumni Club, Inc., was held via virtual meeting/ZOOM on May 11, 2020. This was the first time that a video meeting was held due to COVID-19 pandemic precautions. The meeting commenced at 7:05 pm with President Zacke Naughton presiding.

**Adoption of Agenda.** A motion was made by Mr. Jordan to adopt the agenda. The motion was seconded by Mr. Trinter. **Motion carried.** 

**Adoption of Minutes.** A motion was made by Mr. D. Smith to adopt the minutes from March 9, 2020. The motion was seconded by Mr. Campbell. **Motion carried.** 

**President's Remarks.** President Naughton thanked everyone for attending with this new format and appreciates everyone participating with the pandemic challenges in place. He also shared that we will talk more about our budget and finances later tonight along with voting digitally for the award recipients.

**OSUMB Report.** Dr. Hoch said to disregard the March meeting information since much has changed with COVID-19. He is planning for a full marching band season and three leadership groups are currently in place.

- **a.** Show planning/themes are complete and the 2020 Drum Majors have been selected, with gratitude expressed toward Miss Graf and Mr. Halter for their assistance. This was done with videos for the first time.
- **b.** The Squad Leader retreat will occur this weekend via ZOOM.
- c. The Columbus Symphony concert is still scheduled.
- **d.** Summer Sessions will continue-the first half will be by video lessons with live sessions beginning on July 14th if the university re-opens.
- **e.** There is uncertainty right now about classes and size limits and how that will affect the marching band; marching band will exist, but more specific details will be available as the summer progresses.
- f. There is no information about how the fall football season will look at this time.
- **g.** The TBDBITL Reunion is still considered active at this time (September 5th) but it could change.
- **h.** OSUMB auditions will be held, but the process could be adjusted to include video performances. More information will become available as the summer progresses.

*i.* The travel plans remain uncertain for the band's attendance at away games or the BOA competition; these events remain on the calendar until notified differently.

**OSUAA Report.** Mr. Little reports that the OSUAA is offering ZOOM meetings for leadership of the Alumni groups and we are invited. He offered that the association has resources available if needed for programming, and a guide to help navigate other resources. Our new OSUAA President/CEO is Molly Ranz Calhoun, who began her tenure on May 1st. She has served OSU for over 30 years and is a 1986 graduate. He encouraged us to watch our emails for multiple resources to help with any adjustments encountered with COVID-19. The Symposium remains scheduled for October 8-9, 2020, and it may be a virtual/video experience. More information will be shared as it is known.

#### **Committee Reports: Oral.**

- 1. Active Band. Dr. Leppla reported that a decision has been made to cancel the season due to the inability to rehearse together until July 6th (this was too late for earlier concert events). The prime consideration was concern for the health of our members, or those who have family members who are at risk of becoming sick. The next time for meeting will be at the Reunion in September. The plan is to reassemble on the first Monday in October to prepare for the 2021 season. Mr. Smith encouraged those who are interested in playing, to consider playing with the Hyper Active Band.
- 2. Finance. See Attachments. Mr. Kirkendall stated that he compares our current year against last year: and income brought in for April along with our membership dues have improved from 2019. In addition, we have healthy reserves with minimal changes. A decision has been made, after much research, to move our account to Huntington where they have multiple locations and improved features.
- 3. Reunion. Miss Lawhon reports that she is deferring to Dr. Hoch once he has more information from the university. Registration is being placed on hold for now, with potential to open in mid-July. Once this is formalized, we will have a direct link to the ticket office to purchase game day tickets (instead of going through the alumni club). More information will follow
- **4.** Written Reports. See attachments for reports from HyperActive Band and the Development Fund, beginning with the Script Ohio fund.

#### Old Business.

1. July meeting agenda topic. President Naughton stated that for now, the white board/free form idea/strategizing will be placed on hold for now.

#### **New Business.**

1. Awards. Time was spent voting for the candidate for the Script Ohio award, and the Elvin Donaldson award. Mr. Beis reviewed the description of each award and he named the candidates for each category. Voting was completed by email or texting President Naughton; or by selecting a choice on the video screen.

For both awards, 51% of participation is required.

For the Script Ohio Award, 39 members voted via Zoom; 4 were via text or email; and 5 abstained.

For the Elvin Donaldson Award, 42 members voted; 4 were via text/email, and 2 abstained. Added information: Heather Phillips Smith had requested to remove her name from the list of the Script Ohio Award candidates.

2. Reunion Volunteer. Miss Lawhon introduced her daughter Gina, who has proposed an idea for her Eagle Scout project. Gina would like to create a Living History program where alumni members can contribute memories/experiences which can be digitally preserved. It was

suggested that she talk with OSU's Trademark and Licensing department first so that there are no challenges. Gina is hopeful that this can be completed during Reunion.

- 3. Strategic Plan. See Attachments. Mr. K. Smith shared an analysis of the summary findings and overview, with recommendations to be presented at the next meeting. Refer to the attachment/slide show for the five key findings. Mr. Elson suggested that the next step in planning should be that the board members think about what this organization could look like in five years. A new survey will be sent to the board from President Naughton.
- 4. Budget. See Attachments. Mr. Kirkendall did not make any changes with the future events (Golf Outing, HyperActive events) until more is known about their occurrence. He reports that the budget is an estimate. A motion was made by Mr. Alden to pass the budget. The motion was seconded by Mr. Hutchinson. **Motion carried.**

#### Announcements.

- 1. President Naughton reminded the board to take the survey that is being sent out this evening.
- 2. Mr. Behn stated that the committee's goal will be to get the audit completed by July.
- 3. Mr. Boriin and Dr. Hoch discussed the Fairytale Wedding show on DisneyPlus where members of the OSUMB were participants and Lisa Galvin did a special arrangement of music for one of their songs. It is Season two, Episode one.
- 4. Mr. Donnell shared that he will volunteer to continue as the Active Band chairman for the 2021 season.
- 5. It was shared that Miss Graf will be officially retiring from her career and congratulations were provided.

**ADJOURNMENT:** A motion was made by Mr. Alden to adjourn. The motion was seconded by Mr. Daron; **motion carried.** 

**NEXT MEETING:** Monday, July 13, 2020 at 7:00 pm. The destination will be determined closer to that date depending on if the University has opened up buildings or not secondary to the COVID-19 pandemic.

# Background

- December 2019 two main engagement/climate surveys completed
  - TBDBITL Varsity Band
  - TBDBITL Alumni
- Responses
  - Varsity Band, N= 245 R= 73%
  - Alumni, N= 3136 R= 43%
  - Great standard distribution and low P Squared (<.05)</li>



# Fun But Useless Things

- 34% of alumni don't want any additional involvement
  - ½ of this group participates in the reunion
  - 6% of this group is dissatisfied with this decision of theirs
- Mellophone players and student staff alumni are the most hungry to get more involved
- Alumni of 11-15 years are the most likely to be dissatisfied with their current level of involvement (which is 40% uninvolved, 45% reunion only, and 15% involved more than the reunion)
- 20% of respondents have participated in 20+ reunions, 20% have participated in 0





Key Findings #2

 51% of alumni report feeling somewhat satisfied/somewhat dissatisfied ("Meh") to very dissatisfied with their current level of involvement

Breaking this down:

- "Meh" Alumni
  - 3% already active
  - 27% don't want any more involvement
  - 70% want more with the right opportunity
- · Somewhat dissatisfied Alumni
  - 92% (!) want more
- Highly dissatisfied Alumni
  - 20% good with no more
  - 80% want more





Biggest Barriers to Participation

- 1. Events too far away (43%)
- 2. Job/alternative responsibilities (26%)
- 3. Chops out of shape (23%)
- 4. Alternatives are too costly (16%)
- 5. No instrument (16%)



# Key Findings #4

# Top 5 Ways Alumni Like to Create Impact

- Want to help the current band "maintain traditions" No surprise there!
- 2. Mentor current members
- 3. Support financially
- 4. Motivate and encourage members
- 5. Career networking





Would increase participation if these options were available:

- 1. OSU Away game scheduled close to me (50%)
- 2. Regional/hyperactive band closer to my area (47%)
- 3. Joint performances with OSUMB other than reunion (32%)
- 4. Major events in U.S. other than football (e.g. parades, etc.) (29%)
- 5. Events coordinated with OSUAA (20%)



# Analysis and Summary

- Over half of alumni are open to more and/or alternative forms of engagement
- Desire for more involvement + biggest barriers presents largest opportunity for strategic plan to create alternative forms of engagement for our club other than current offerings
- Disconnect between how supportive alumni are about evolution/encouragement and social media behaviors (from alumni)
- Opportunities to create impact beyond reunions, performances, and donations should be explored yet they should focus on creating impact for current band members



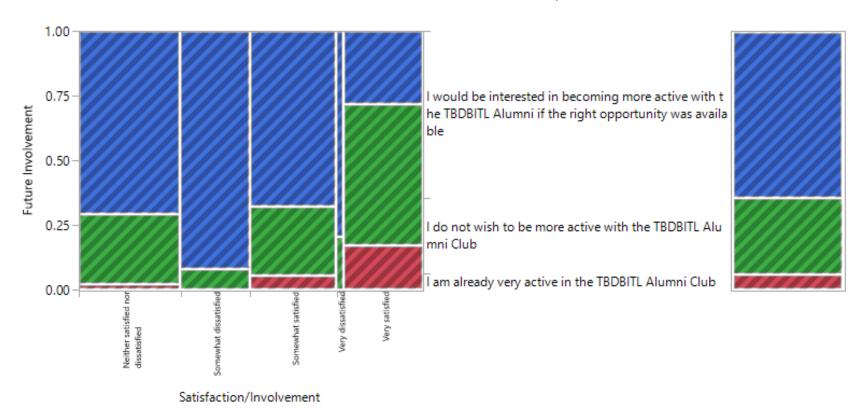


# Where from here?

#### 2020 Budget Notes

Methodology - Our books are usually consistent from year-to-year, but 2020 will be an outlier given the Covid-19 scenario. Our budget process started with prior year actual expenditures and then adjustments are made for known differences between 2019 to 2020. Keep in mind this is a budget and we can choose to spend differently later in the year depending upon how things are going.

#### **Highlights**

Active Band - to be conservative, we removed all financial activity. Last year, this committee generated \$11k of profit for the club. Due to the uncertainty, I think it's best to plan for no revenue and if it comes in later, that will be a bonus.

- Hyper-Active Band at this point, no changes have been made from 2019 activity. Per my conversations with Greg D., events coming up in the next month or so have been rescheduled for later dates.
  - Donation represents dollars paid to Cheerleader's Endowment for their participation in the HyperFriday event.
- **Golf/Reunion** no change at this point from 2019 to 2020.
- Script Ohio we spent a little more than \$4k last year, but I bumped up to \$5k for budget purposes.
- **TBDBITL Club (everything else)** no major cost other than adding the software subscription and the adjustment to the endowment contribution. See below.
- Endowment Contribution this is our last year of the \$50k pledge commitment. However, given the drop in other revenues, I moved it down to \$40k for 2020. This is our main lever that we can adjust and our decision can be modified at the end of the year once all the dust settles.

We are showing a negative net income for the year due to a drop in projected revenues and the endowment contribution. However, I believe we are still in good shape given our cash reserves and the fact that the majority of our other expenses are variable, meaning they are tied to specific events. If we have the events, the revenue and expenses come in and if we don't, neither come in.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

- Revenue and net income are ahead of where we were in 2019. Membership dues are up about \$1,000.
- Expenses are also quite a bit lighter so far this year, primarily because most of our activities have been halted due to Covid-19. Most of our activity is variable in that it depends on our activities. For example, we aren't traveling right now so we don't have some of those same expenses that we had in 2019.
- Moving to the balance sheet, our cash balance is lower than it was at this time last year by \$6k,
  which is primarily due to us being in the red last year. Keep in mind we did not have to dip into
  our savings reserve to cover that. We have a healthy amount of reserves, so we are in good
  shape right now.
- The last report is the breakdown by department of our income and expenses. Again, it's not uncommon for this to be a lighter time of the year. Most of our major activities haven't gotten going from a financial standpoint.
